Golf Club Support

- Allowing placement of a poster in the pro shop / locker room with details of the event and a link to our fundraising page
- Provision of a small space on the day of the event to raise funds and awareness of the challenge to your members and visitors
- Sharing information about the event via your club mailing list to raise awareness of the challenge
- Providing access to the course and/or practice facilities prior to the challenge to record a short golf vlog to be published as part of a wider documentary series alongside PGA Pro Dan Hendrickson
- Allowing the team to record an On Course Foundation beneficiary playing a signature hole or recreating a famous golf shot at your golf club
- Undertaking one off fundraising activities at your golf club such as a charity golf competition, auction or raffle, before, during or after the challenge
- Permitting access to your welfare facilities for participants and the support team during the challenge
- Supporting the team with some refreshments as they stop by
- Donating a fourball voucher for fundraising purposes
